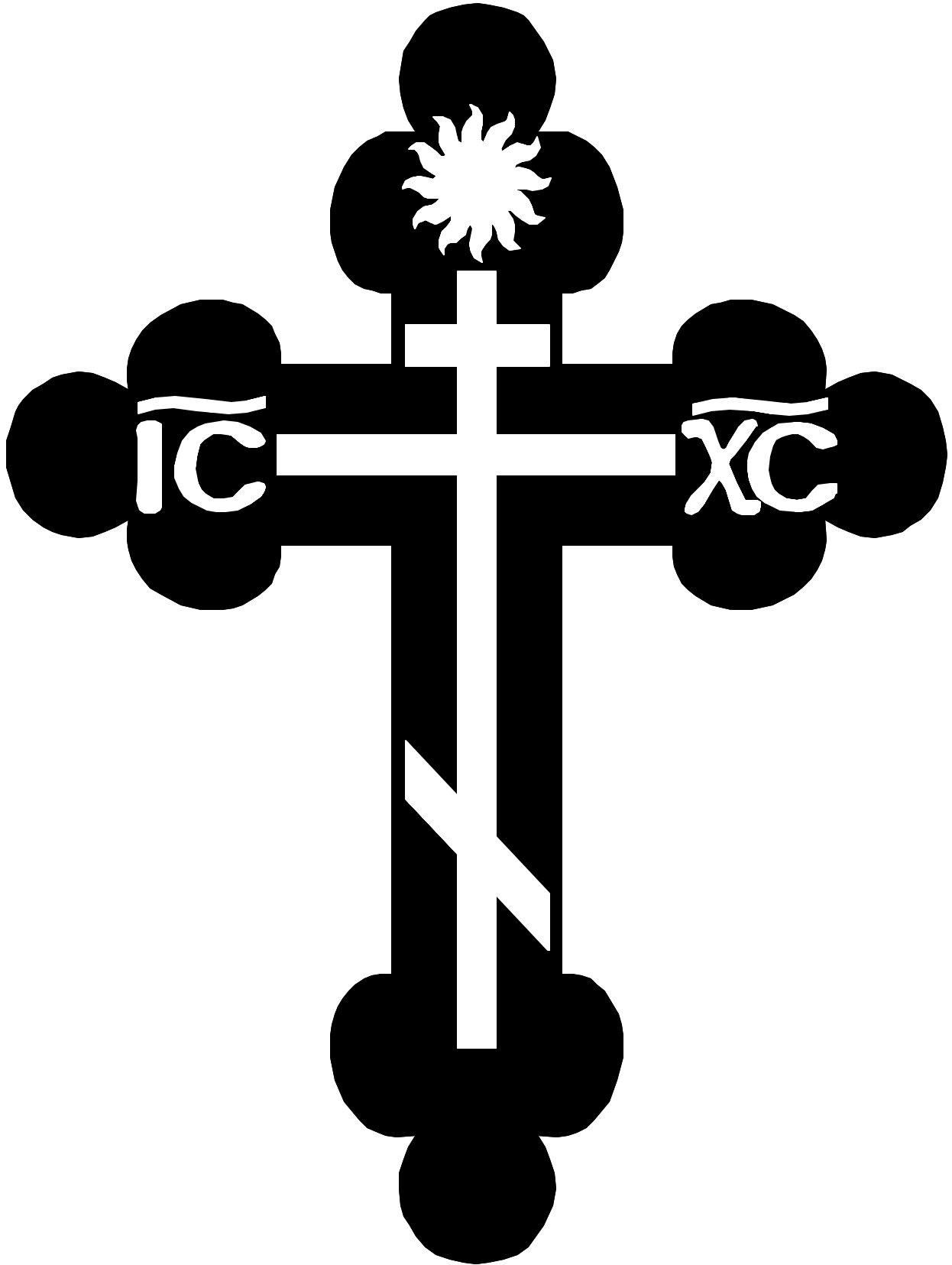

If form A is used, penitential rite can end with the Kyrie in either the English or Greek version, preferable set to music

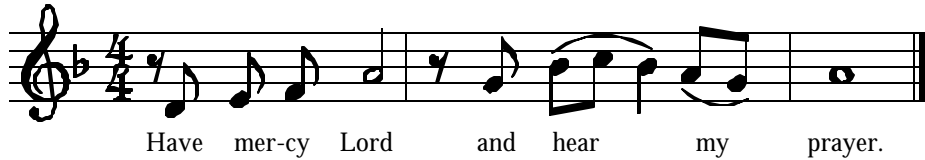

nor let your beloved know decay.

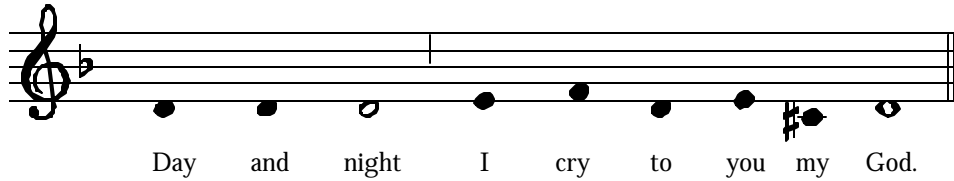

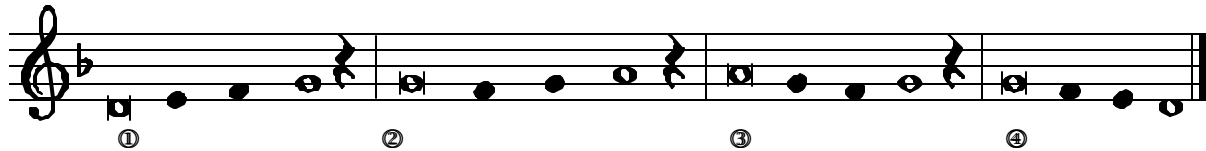

God has destined us for acquiring salvation through our Lord Je-sus Christ. * He died for us, that all of us, whether we are awake or asleep, together might live with him.

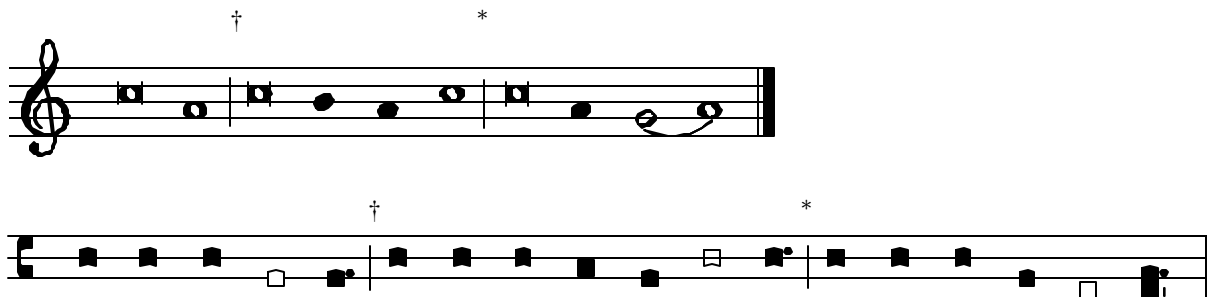
TUESDAY 1 Peter 5:8-9a
